Energy Assistance Extended Through September 30

In response to the COVID-19 crisis, the Department of Administration has adjusted the eligibility requirements for residents who are seeking heating and electric assistance through the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP). Eligibility will now be based on the household's previous month of income, rather than the former requirement of the previous three months of income. This will allow those who are recently affected by COVID-19 to receive assistance quickly. Energy Assistance will be open through September 30 for the heating season 2019-2020, with the 2020-2021 season beginning October 1.

Barron Electric Becomes a 100% Green Facility

Dairyland recently created an Evergreen 100% Green Facility program, which retires renewable energy credits (RECs) to match the annual energy consumption of member cooperative facilities. The retired RECs assigned to each cooperative come from Dairyland's renewable generation facilities and power purchase agreements, which include solar, wind, hydro and biogas resources. Over 800 credits were retired on Barron Electric's behalf, which makes the cooperative a 100% Green Facility.

Her volunteer work with the Wisconsin Northwest Heritage Passage focuses primarily on supporting their non-profit Arts in Hands gallery, located in downtown Spooner. She volunteers in the gallery as well as providing presentations to those interested in learning more about the history of the art displayed. Beverly remarked, "When I retired, I felt strongly about continuing to be active with these two organizations, in support of their respective missions of water stewardship and the local arts."

Beverly has also been a long-time volunteer with Hunt Hill Audubon Sanctuary and the Washburn County Humane Society, assisting them at educational and fund-raising events. She served on the Board of Directors of Hunt Hill Audubon Sanctuary in the early 1990's, and, with former Board member Bob Dreis, worked to obtain State Scientific Natural

Area designation for part of the Sanctuary property.
