

Biggest Storm in Cooperative History Costs \$1.5 Million

n July 19, Barron Electric Cooperative's service territory was impacted by a severe windstorm and two confirmed tornadoes (EF-0 and EF-1) which left widespread damage, costing the cooperative \$1.5 Million. Barron Electric members experienced long-term power outages with the majority of members having power restored within eight days. Wisconsin Governor Evers declared a State of Emergency and remarked, "I know many people, especially in northern and central Wisconsin, have been impacted by the strong storms and power outages."

Over 9,500 Barron Electric members were without power. Widespread outages affected the southern half of Barron Electric's territory. Eight substations were affected, four completely lost power and four lost partial power. Approximately 1,800 members are served by each substation.

Over 65 crew members including linemen from Barron Electric, Bayfield, Chippewa Valley, Eau Claire, Jump River, Pierce Pepin and St. Criox Electric Cooperatives, plus Barron Municipal, Cumberland Municipal, and Rice Lake Municipal restored power. Zielies Tree Service

have been instrumental in the decline of native pollinators and bee populations. The Monarch Butterfly population has greatly declined in the past 20 years.

Barron Electric Member Cindy Sesolak has always liked butterflies and is helping make a difference for this pollinator. She is involved in the Monarch Watch Tagging Program, which started in 1992 to help understand the monarch's fall migration through mark and recapture. Tagging helps determine the origins of monarchs that make it to Mexico, and their original location, size, and date makes a difference in their survival. Monarch Watch distributes more than a quarter of a million tags to volunteers who tag monarchs as they migrate through their area. She commented, "Last year, I raised 52 monarchs and tagged 12. You only tag the mid-August hatch as those are the ones that fly to Mexico." She plans to travel to Mexico next year to track the journey of the Monarch Butterflies. 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helped clear trees ahead of the line crews. PUSH, Inc. helped reset broken poles. Barron Electric's damage included 100+ broken poles, 170 individual transformer outages and 226 lines repaired. Crews worked 15-hour days and 10 straight days, in working conditions that included heat, humidity, rain, and wind.

Cooperative Response Center, CRC, is Barron Electric's call center. They received 13 calls per minute at the beginning of the storm from Barron Electric members. From July 19-July 29, CRC answered 15,000 calls.
