\$1,000 Scholarships Available to Help Students Reach Their Goals

Barron Electric will award \$14,000 in scholarships to fourteen high school seniors this spring. Take advantage of this great opportunity!

Eligibility

Graduating seniors are eligible if they attend any of the high schools listed, and whose parents or guardians are current members of Barron Electric. The high schools include: Barron, Birchwood, Cameron, Chetek-Weyerhaeuser, Clayton, Clear Lake, Cumberland, Hayward, New Auburn, Prairie Farm, Rice Lake, Shell Lake, Spooner, and Turtle Lake. Condensed Board Minutes November 28, 2018

- Director Helm gave the treasurer's report, with comments by Manager Sloan. A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #95235 thru #95354 of CCF Bank was in the amount of \$335,104 and capital credit estate checks of \$24,637. Director Helm reported on activity of total receipts in the office \$2,404,257; total receipts by wire and ACH \$1,175,510; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire 2,011,015; transfer of funds was made for payroll \$193,551 and power bill paid 11/30/18 in the amount of \$2,139,757.
- Outages year-to-date stand at 41,818 consumer hours off, which is 79.9% below 2017 hours of 207,855. Overtime year-to-date is 3,170.75 hours, which is 28.6% below 2017 hours of 4,440.



Cook's Corner

German Chocolate Cream Cheese Bars Sharon Gotautis

18 ¼ oz. German Chocolate Cake Mix 8 oz. package cream cheese (room temp.) ½ cup sugar 1 cup milk chocolate chips (divided)

Prepare cake according to box. Pour into 9x13 greased pan. In small bowl, beat cream cheese and sugar. Stir in ¼ cup chocolate chips. Drop by tablespoons over batter. Cut through batter with a knife to swirl cream cheese mixture. Sprinkle with remaining chips.

Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool and cut into bars. Can use a 15x10 pan for thinner bars.
