Barron Electric Cooperative has joined forces with the National Rural Electric Cooperative's Voices for Cooperative Power to support the Fixing Emergency Management for Americans Act of 2025 (H.R. 4669), a critical bill to strengthen disaster response and recovery. Electric cooperatives operate in some of the most disaster-prone areas of the country. FEMA plays a vital role in helping cooperatives restore power and rebuild infrastructure after storms, wildfires, and other disasters. The FEMA Act of 2025 would streamline reimbursements, improve access to mitigation funds, and ensure faster, smarter recovery efforts, and we need your voice to make sure it passes. More than 50,000 letters nationwide have been sent to Congress. The bill now has 32-cosponsors, but Congress has yet to vote. # Dairyland Power Acquires Natural Gas Plants

airyland Power Cooperative announced the acquisition of two Illinois natural gas plants, which include the 480-MW Elgin Energy Center and the 330-MW Rocky Road facility in East Dundee. Brent Ridge, Dairyland Power President and CEO said, "As we continue to develop a balanced, diversified energy portfolio to support increased demand across our service territory, these facilities will play a critical role in providing the flexible, dependable energy our members rely on every day."

Dairyland has retired nearly 600 MW of coal generation since 2014, and is adding more clean energy to its portfolio with the help of a \$595 million New Empowering Rural America federal award by securing power purchase agreements for approximately 1,000 MW of wind and solar projects in the Midwest, while investing in critical transmission upgrades that support grid reliability and resiliency.

Mike Baker, Vice President of Barron Electric's Board of Directors and Dairyland Power Cooperative Board Director, represents District 3, which includes the following townships: Crystal, Stone Lake, Sand Lake, Beaverbrook, Madge, Birchwood, Sarona, and Cedar Lake.

• A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #104672 through #104763 from CCF Bank in the amount of \$1,333,384. Total receipts in the office \$3,059,648; total receipts by wire and ACH \$2,317,450; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire \$4,114,634;

transfer of funds was made for payroll \$217,995 and the power bill was paid on 09/24/2025 in the amount of \$2,641,283.

- The board reviewed the DPC Cooperative Contributions Program which allows
  Dairyland Power Cooperative members to request a \$1,000 contribution in our
  cooperative's service area. Director Baker moved, Director Kessler seconded,
  to donate \$1,000 from the DPC Cooperative Contributions Program to the Rice
  Lake Marshfield Hospice Center. Motion carried.
- The CoBank Sharing Success Program allows up to 4 requests with a total of \$15,000 matching funds to organizations that meet the CoBank Sharing Success criteria. Currently, there is \$4,000 remaining that can be matched for 2025.
- Director Blaskowski moved to table the CoBank Sharing Success Program until the October board meeting, seconded by Director Baker. Motion carried. A list of donation requests that were not approved by the board in 2025 will be emailed for review prior to the board meeting.
- The board reviewed the Dairyland Power Cooperative Scholarship Program in which one \$500 scholarship will be issued annually to each DPC member per the cooperative's eligibility requirements. Since the announcement of the scholarship program, DPC has increased the amount to \$1,000 annually. Director Warwick moved, Director Effertz seconded, to utilize the DPC Scholarship Program. Motion carried.
- A membership list of 42 was presented and approved without objection.
