

Barron Electric Lineworkers Awarded Cooperative Hero Award

Barron Electric Cooperative lineworkers, Aaron Holten and Tyler Romsos, are the recipients of the inaugural Wisconsin Electric Cooperative Association's Cooperative Hero Award. This award recognizes individuals who demonstrate exemplary character in a life-saving effort, either on or off the job.

This past spring, Aaron and Tyler were working to replace a meter socket at the home of John Offord, when Aaron heard a loud noise from a nearby shed. Inside, they found John lying on the floor with a cut on his head. The lineworkers called 911 and used their first aid and safety training to tend to John as they waited for first responders. They also contacted his wife, who was not home at the time. John was transported to the hospital where he was treated for severe dehydration. He was released and made a full recovery.

In recalling the situation, John wrote that he remembers feeling weak and light-headed from the hot sun, adding, "I walked into

my shed and passed out. When I came to a little later, Mr. Holten was by me on the floor telling me to just lean against him and that they had called the ambulance. They stayed until the ambulance arrived. I would like to personally thank both of these men for their care and concern." Barron Electric Cooperative Director of Operations Nate Steines said, "Aaron and Tyler's swift response to this situation played a major role in the member's full recovery."





Payments are due on the 28th of each month. For members enrolled in Auto Pay, billing deductions will take place between the 25th and 28th of the month.

They may be on your property by foot, ATV, or UTV, taking photos of Barron Electric equipment, posting signs, or locating cable.

GMS employees will have a badge, letter of contract, and their equipment will include a contracted by Barron Electric Cooperative sign.

Once complete, this project will improve the outage dispatch process and provide a safer electric system for line crews, contractors, members, and the public. During outages, this will allow better communication from the cooperative to our membership.

*Condensed Board Minutes

September 25, 2024

Tim Kessler is treasurer of Barron Electric's Board of Directors. He represents District 2 which includes the following townships: Evergreen, Spooner, Dewey, Bashaw, and Barronett.

- A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #103423 through #103581 from CCF Bank in the amount of \$208,093 with no capital credit estate checks. Total receipts in the office \$2,316,485; total receipts by wire and ACH \$253,275; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire \$2,236,947; transfer of funds was made for payroll \$232,075 and the power bill was paid on 09/25/2024 in the amount of \$2,513,055.
- Director of Operations Steines presented information to the board regarding pre-approval to the 2025 Budget to purchase primary and secondary wire. Director Olson moved, Director Mandel seconded, to pre-approve the purchase of primary and secondary wire to the 2025 Budget. Motion carried.
- A membership list of 77 was presented and approved without objection.
- Form 219 summarizing construction activity for the month of August in the amount of \$274,137.20
 was presented for approval and included new services \$57,373.73; change jobs \$23,288.52; Other
 Work Order Projects \$193,474.95 and 16 retirements. The Form 219 stood approved as presented.
