DISTRICT 4


(Three-year term)

Members will elect directors to represent Districts 2, 4, and 8, as highlighted on the map.





How Can You Run for a Director Position?

- 1. Director nominees should obtain a petition from Barron Electric's office.

 -This requires signatures from ten(10) members, living within the director district that the nominee would represent
 - -Nominees must meet director qualifications as printed in the Cooperative Bylaws. Log into your SmartHub account to view a copy of the bylaws, or contact our office at barronec@barronelectric.com. Section 3 on page 6 lists the director qualifications. If you do not have a SmartHub account, you can create one by visiting Barron Electric's home page at barronelectric.com.
- 2. A photograph and candidate information submitted with the signed petition will be published in the candidate profile section in the annual report and in the News for You.
- 3. Petitions must be received by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on **Wednesday**, **February 18**, **2026** in order to have the nominee's name appear on the printed ballot.
- 4. Mail petitions to: Barron Electric Cooperative, Attn: Jennifer Horstman, PO Box 40, Barron, WI 54812.
- 5. Nominations of candidates to the post of Director may be made from the floor during the Annual Meeting on Thursday, April 9.

Resolutions

All formal resolutions, which are to be presented to the annual meeting, will be reviewed by a Resolutions Committee prior to the Notice of the Annual Meeting being sent. This will not restrict the right of any member to make simple motions at the Annual Meeting. Copies of resolutions to be presented and considered at the Annual Meeting will be mailed in advance to the membership so that each member will have time to review.

All resolutions must be in writing, properly signed, dated, and with member's address and phone number. Hand-written resolutions will be considered only if legible as determined by the Resolutions Committee. Resolutions to be considered must be received no later than 12:00 p.m. (noon) on **Wednesday**, **February 18**, **2026** and should be addressed to:

*Condensed Board Minutes October 29, 2025

Patricia Mandel serves as secretary on Barron Electric's Board of Directors and represents District 6 which includes the townships of Clinton, Barron, Maple Grove, and Prairie Lake.



- Member Mark Dobberfuhl appeared before the board to request Barron Electric Cooperative waive the new service fee and installation for the new Welcome Center at the Pioneer Village Museum. Discussion regarding the request will move to the CoBank Sharing Success Program.
- The minutes of the Regular Board Meeting, September 23, 2025, were approved as written.
- A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #104764 through #105028 from CCF Bank in the amount of \$710,920. Total receipts in the office \$3,282,155; total receipts by wire and ACH \$2,379,725; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire \$4,191,089; transfer of funds was made for payroll \$220,496 and the power bill was paid on 10/29/2025 in the amount of \$2,071,397.
- Director of Finance Straw presented information to the board regarding the funds from the DPC Spent Nuclear Fuel (SNF) Settlement in the amount of \$637,460.63 for the years 2019-2022. Straw recommended the option to retain the funds and allocate to members based on patronage for the years of 2019-2022 to be included in general retirement for those years. Notice of the additional allocation can be included with the 2026 allocation notices. Retaining the funds will appear as revenue/margins in 2025. Director Warwick moved, Director Mandel seconded, to approve Straw's recommendation. Discussion. Motion carried.
- Director of Operations Steines presented information to the board regarding
 the pre-approval of SCADA to the 2026-2027 Budgets. Pre-approval of the NXT
 purchases needed for 2026 & 2027 budgets will allow us to purchase with the
 current pricing and not be billed until the inventory has been received. Director
 Effertz moved, Director Warwick seconded, to approve the pre-approval of the
 NXT purchases to the 2026 & 2027 budgets. Motion carried.
- A membership list of 88 was presented and approved without objection.
- Form 219 summarizing construction activity for the month of September in the amount of \$494,112.34 was presented for approval and included new services \$80,845.66; change jobs \$27,219.76; Other Work Order Projects \$386,046.92 and 3 retirements. The Form 219 stood approved as presented.
- Outages year-to-date stand at 78,907.35 consumer hours off, which is 7.71% below 2024 hours of 85,500.41. Overtime year-to-date is 2,877 hours, which is 0.24% below 2024 hours of 2,844.
