
Barron Electric is proud to recognize these high school students who each won a \$1,000 scholarship. The cooperative has given \$394,500 in scholarships since 1985.







The facility charge covers all fixed expenses and does not fluctuate based on members' usage. Some of the infrastructure needed to provide reliable power include substations, transformers, poles, power lines, trucks, and maintenance. With upward pressure, supply chain issues, and the price of transformers, equipment, wire, and fuel increasing, Barron Electric's Board of Directors will be evaluating the rates and fixed charge while ensuring that costs are spread fairly among all members.
