

Prime Spot for EV Charging and Dinner

Barron Electric Cooperative recently held a grand opening for a 50 KW, Level 3, DC fast charger and a Level 2 charger which were installed at The Prime Bar and Family Dining in Trego. Electric vehicle owners will have the opportunity to stop and charge their vehicle and stay for dinner. Barron Electric also has charging stations at their offices in Barron and Spooner. Jennifer Beaudette, Director of Member Services at Barron Electric, remarked, "Most Level 3 chargers provide an 80% charge in as little as 30 minutes, providing the quickest way to charge a vehicle." Jeff Springer, Manager of Innovation and Efficient Electrification at Dairyland Power, said, "This is the gateway to the north, as it fills a 155-mile gap between fast chargers on Highway 53."

*Condensed Board Minutes August 25, 2021



David Olson represents District 1 on Barron Electric's Board of Directors, which includes the following townships: Brooklyn, Gull Lake, Stinnett, Hayward, Scott, Casey, Trego,

Springbrook, Bass Lake, and Rusk.

- Director Kessler gave the treasurer's report, with comments by General Manager Torud. A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #99228 thru #99323 of CCF Bank was in the amount of \$244,953 and capital credit estate checks in the amount of \$13,750. Director Kessler reported on activity of total receipts in the office \$2,167,128; total receipts by wire and ACH \$403,090; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire \$2,132,498; transfer of funds was made for payroll \$206,902 and power bill paid 08/25/2021 in the amount of \$2,462,685.
- A membership list of 116 was presented and approved without objection by the board.
- Director Baker reported on the DPC meeting he attended on August 18 & 19, 2021. The directors discussed the 85th Annual Meeting held on August 19, 2021. The directors reviewed the Monthly Safety Report from Denise Fox, Compliance Safety and Training Officer.
- Form 219 summarizing construction activity for the month of July in the amount of \$111,559.96 was presented for approval, and included new services – \$26,384.34; change jobs - \$12,847.12; miscellaneous - \$72,328.50 and 1 retirement. The Form 219 stood approved as presented.
- Outages year-to-date stand at 19,398 consumer hours off, which is 71.71% below 2020 hours of 68,560. Overtime year-to-date is 2,064.25 hours, which is 14.66% below 2020 hours of 2,418.75.

Great Pumpkin Dessert

Prior to that, they carried lanterns to the barn and moved them along as needed. He added that his mother continued to use the wood stove for cooking, as she was accustomed to that. Although, she enjoyed the used electric mixer she received. Arnie's father and his uncle really liked their ½" electric drill. The electric cooler came in handy as they did not need to chop ice. Arnie remarked, "Electricity made life easier."
